MATERIALS

DB38105 28oz Giant Mug
Medium Brush
Detail Brush
Liner Brush
Fan Brush
Water-Based Marker
Ballpoint Pen
NCR Fish Pattern

COLORS

CMM 2 - Stonewashed

CMM 48 - Guacamole

CMM 85 - Oceanscape

CMM 62 - Just Blue

CMM 11 - Blue Lagoon

CMM 46 - Sunnyside Up

CMM 69 - Carrot Juice

CMM 98 - Red Head

CMM 67 - Snowflake



INSTRUCTIONS


- 1. Thin down Just Blue paint with 50% water to 50% paint.
- 2. Use a fan brush to apply 2 coats of the watered-down paint to the outside of the mug.
- 3. When the outside of the mug is dry, apply the fish using the patterns. To do this, press firmly as you trace over the lines in the pattern.
- 4. Thin down the following colors with 40% water to 60% paint: Sunnyside Up, Carrot Juice, Red Head
- 5. Lay the mug on the side to paint the fish, this will help the watercolors from running.
- 6. To apply the watered-down paint to the fish, instead of brushing the paint on, load up the detail or liner brush and drop a ball of paint onto the section you want to fill in.

 Then, gently move the paint around to create a heavy layer. Load up the brush as needed until the section is filled in.
- 7. Fill in the fish that you'd like to be in the red/orange/yellow color scheme.
- 8. Next, water down Oceanscape, Blue Lagoo, and Guacamole with 40% water and 60% paint.
- 9. Use the same technique and fill in the fish that you'd like to be in the blue/green color scheme.
- 10. Paint the handle with 3 coats of Oceanscape using a medium brush.
- 11. Fill in the inside of the mug with 3 coats of Guacamole using a fan brush.
- 12. Dip the handle of your smallest brush into Snowflake paint. Tap the paint onto the fish to create an eye.
- 13. Use a liner brush and one coat of watered-down Stonewashed to apply the mouths.
- 14. When the eyes are dry, use the same technique to add a little dot of Stonewashed for the pupil.
- 15. When the mug is dry, use a water-based marker or pencil to gently sketch out the writing mug. Then, use a detail brush and Stonewashed paint to apply 1 coat to the words.

TIPS

• To apply the watered-down paint to the fish, don't brush the paint on, this will leave streaks. Instead, load up the detail or liner brush and drop a ball of paint onto the piece. Then, gently move it around to create a heavy layer. Load up the brush as needed until the section is filled in.
